A Message from UNA President Tim Florinki given at our Founders' Day Celebration on October 1

Welcome. We are today celebrating the 4 years of hard work given by our volunteers to achieve our goal of establishing a community arts center for Cadillac and the surrounding area.

I would first like to thank all the volunteers, many of whom are here today, for all their efforts put forth to create a home for the arts in our community.

We received help from area manufacturers, independent businesses, area contractors, skilled volunteers, and contributions from many members of our community. It took much effort on the part of many people to bring the vision of a community arts center to fruition.

Today we are honoring our founding members as you have heard of the things they have all done to create a safe and open inspiring place to be creative.

As Robert L. Lynch, President of Americans for the Arts, stated: "The arts empower. The arts give a voice to the voiceless. The arts help transform American communities and, as I often say, the result can be a better child, a better town, a better nation and certainly a better world. Let's champion our arts action heroes, emulate them and make our communities everything we want hem to be."

Art is often a vehicle for social change. It can give voice to the politically or socially disenfranchised. A song, film or novel can rouse emotions in those who encounter it, inspiring them to rally for change. The impact that art has on society is threefold, it comes from the individual's reaction to the work, the power inherent in the work and the environmental factors surrounding the work.

There are many ways the Art Center is utilized. We're the home for visual arts lessons and displays, private music lessons, The Irish Dancers, Reader's Theatre, and community group meetings, just to name a

few. In the future, we hope to develop an active children's program and interface with veterans and assisted living residents.

A Brief History of Up North Arts

It all began in 2012, when Chris Fisher put an "Art Center" donation jar out at a Jewelry and Bead Show at the Cadillac High School. The \$488 from that event was given to the Cadillac Arts Council to hold as a "building fund" line item in their budget. Over the next two years, subsequent donations brought the total to \$10,320.91.

In April 2015, a task force of **Cadillac Arts Council members** began meeting. Their vision was to establish a common location for all Art Council member organizations to coexist and share resources to further the arts and cultural enrichment of the community.

2016 was spent searching for a physical location, writing bylaws, obtaining non-profit status, working on a business plan and discussing grant writing and fundraising opportunities. On April 4th, we became a "real" entity. In October of 2016, UNA Board Members and Council representatives toured the vacant portion of the former Naval Reserve complex at 601 Chestnut Street. Most were favorably impressed with the location and opportunities this building offered for classroom space.

On July 17, 2017, **Chris Fisher**, UNA President, signed the original lease at the City Hall. We were in business! The hard work of transforming the space into a functional, esthetically pleasing art center began. By August, **Paul and Nancy Brown, Laura Porter, Chuck and Val Fales and Mindy Hinkle** were working tirelessly cleaning floors, walls, sinks, toilets and the kitchen, prior to painting! **25 Rexair** employees did the painting. Throughout the Fall of 2017, contractors, tradespeople, and volunteers worked to make the building ADA compliant and to upgrade the infrastructure to meet building codes. Even with a wealth of donated labor and supplies, UNA spent over \$11,400 remodeling the building and bringing it into ADA compliance.

2018 brought an uptick in classes and attendance and the **Northern Lites Readers Theatre** added the performing arts to our offerings.

2019 was the first year of a full class schedule. Classes included fused glass, clay, painting, fiber, ukulele, knitting, jewelry making, and a summer art camp for the kids.

In 2020, **Betsy Clark and Loretta Hubbard** helped clean out and paint the two new children's classrooms. Donations from groups and individuals led to the purchase of furniture and supplies for our new **Children's Art Center**.

Then, Covid-19 hit!!! UNA had to shut down. What a blow to a struggling, fledgling 501-C3! UNA was determined to serve the community during this dismal time. We created an activity for kids called "Art with a Heart" and the kids decorated and displayed yard signs around the town. We also sponsored an "Art Camp to Go" for kids who were sequestered in their homes. Each child was given a bag of art supplies and two lesson plans to get them creating at home. Money became very tight! Even though UNA was closed, expenses, of course, continued. A fundraiser called "Paint the Tiles" was initiated, following Covid regulations. Proceeds from that fundraiser bought more furniture for the Children's Center.

It needs to be mentioned that behind many of these projects and among all the hard-working volunteer workers, was the idea-generating hand of Mollie Frier. The addition of **Readers Theatre** and the **July 2020 yART Sale** were just two of her grand ideas.

All of this has been made possible by hard work, generous financial support, and the creative minds of so many of you. It not only takes a village to raise a child, but it also takes a community to bring art and culture to life.
